A Letter From The Chairman

Welcome to the Autumn/Winter 2019 edition of The Hills Echo.

In case you don't know, on 2nd June Buckingham Palace announced that Northwood Hills Residents' Association had been awarded The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service (QAVS). This is the highest award possible for volunteer groups and is the equivalent of an MBE for the group. The award not only recognizes the work of the Committee but also all our road stewards and volunteers. We were all both delighted and humbled when we heard the news. As part of the award two of the Committee attended a Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace and on 4th September, 6 of the Committee attended a London ceremony where we were presented with an engraved crystal with the QAVS logo and a certificate signed by Her Majesty the Queen. The citation reads for "providing inspirational and outstanding services to the Community of Northwood Hills". The Residents' Association is apolitical but I do also need to thank Nick Hurd and our Ward Councillors present and past for their encouragement and support over the last 11 years.

Many of you will have heard Joel Street Farmlands have recently changed hands and there is a lot of speculation that the site could be developed. At the time of writing no planning application has ben received. NHRA and local residents are monitoring the site. The advice we have received is that under current planning rules a planning application is likely to fail but that cannot be guaranteed.

The long debated Controlled Parking Zone has now ben introduced in certain roads in the Ward and we are aware that residents in other roads are worried about "creep", which we are monitoring.

Our next Clean up day is on Saturday Sat 26 October 10 - 11.30am but in addition, a group of volunteers led by the Residents' Association have now taken on the task of bringing the platform gardens at Northwood Hills Station back to life. The first task of digging out all the weeds has been completed and some planting has begun. However, our goal is to enter the gardens into TFL's Station Garden of the year competition in 2020 and dare I say, with fingers crossed, win 1st prize!

Finally, way back in March we started the planning for this year's Christmas Lights event, which is to be held at 4:00pm on Saturday, 16th November. Regrettably, the stage and its trailer storage was stolen over the August Bank Holiday, which gives us an additional challenge to overcome this year. The Deputy Mayor and Father Christmas have confirmed they will be there. We hope you will be too!


14th Posse Bike Show at The Gate Pub



New Sixth Form Block

In October 2016 the school moved into its new building on Pinner Road, but over the summer work began on enlarging the building to incorporate a larger, purpose built Sixth Form block. Jessica Patel, Acting Head of Sixth Form, said, "Due to the increased demand for Sixth Form places at Northwood, we felt that our Sixth Formers needed a bespoke block. The architects have cleverly relocated some classrooms and this has freed up a significant amount of space. We are also building an extension on to a large, but previously unused balcony area.

Once completed, the Sixth Form Block will have three distinct zones: a social area; a study area, and a teaching area. The beauty of this new block, which is due to open in early 2020, is that the Sixth Form will still be incorporated into the main body of the building."

Dear Residents.


I hope you all enjoyed the hot weather during the summer months. Now that Autumn is upon us and the nights are drawing in it's really important to follow some simple crime prevention steps to help deter burglary. We tend to always see a rise in this type of crime during the darker nights. Improving your lighting both inside and outside your home is a good deterrent. I would advise:

- Have good lighting at doors as it makes it safer for you when coming and going after dark.
- A clear, low white light that activates at dusk to dawn is ideal for lighting a yard and garden and allowing any person to be clearly seen.
- Check to make sure that trees and plants do not obscure your lighting. It's recommended that you regularly cut vegetation back.
- Take care to position these lights so that light pollution doesn't annoy your neighbours.
- Use an automatic plugin time switch to operate a lamp or light at pre-set times when you're away.
- Energy saving LED bulbs are best as they do not use as much electric and less of a fire risk

Joel Street Allotments New Water System

Our water supply needed replacing as it had been added to over the years and was a mix of pipes of differing diameters, Imperial and metric. Most of us have put a spade through it at some point, so it was constantly being repaired and costing us money in leaks.

We are an independent site so the upkeep of the water system is our responsibility. And so are the water bills! We started saving to upgrade it and were fortunate to receive a rather generous Ward Budget Grant from our local Councillors. But the rest had to come from our own reserves.

After a lot of research we hired Irrigation Services, who also happen to be the water contractor for the Borough. You may have seen their work on Harefield Pond.

Work started smoothly enough, but they soon encountered a mass of building rubble buried under the grass path. We think it was the demolished remains of WW2 street shelters from The Broadway! So what should have been a week or so turned into a much longer job. The delay meant we had time to seek extra funding to replace the subsidiary pipework as well. We applied for, and received, a grant from the Postcode Local Trust, which funds green space improvements and community access to outdoor space.

It also meant our Site Team had time to sort out fittings for the tanks. We have about three dozen, but every one is different so the fittings had to be individually designed and made.



But now - later than planned, and with rather more expense - we have a modern water system. Thanks to our Ward Councillors and the Postcode Local Trust for helping with funding, and the Site Team and countless other members who have put in hours of work to make it happen.

NHRA AGM 2019

Main points from the 81st Annual General Meeting, Thursday 23rd May 2019; 7:30pm at Hillside Junior School

Minutes of the 2018 AGM: Approved.

<u>Chairman's Report:</u> The Chairman extended a warm welcome, thanked the committee for all their work and gave a summary of the activities of the last 12 months. As well as a number of events, this involved:

The Hills Echo delivered to over 4,000 homes twice in the year & our **new website** was launched.

We considered **growing membership and subscriptions**. As people's lives are changing we need to be as flexible as possible. If you feel comfortable paying online, please do so.

The **Ward Boundary Commission** agreed with the NHRA that Northwood Hills is a community and should not be split into two.

We are grateful to the **Ward Councillors**, the businesses, the Scouts, local Police and **Fairfield** for all the support given.

We spend time opposing some Planning applications. The land at Joel Street Farm has been put up for sale; we cannot stop someone buying the site; until there is a planning application we can't take action.

A small group of residents have joined together to tidy the Station Platform Gardens.

Nick Hurd MP addressed the meeting covering:

Pinner Cottage Hospital: a planning application from the NHS for a new health centre with sheltered housing is now expected by March 2020.

The Safer Neighbourhood Team was thanked for their help with tackling crime

Hon. Treasurer's Report: the unaudited accounts were tabled. The meeting agreed to accept the accounts once the audited version had be presented to the committee.

Election of Officers: agreed.

Constitution amendment was adopted to incorporate the Mission Statement, as on the web site. **PC Max Christmas:** gave an update on the crime figures and the initiatives being undertaken, such as 'A Street a week', library drop ins and the OWL messaging service.

Question Time:

Controlled Parking Zone;1 hour parking restriction in the middle of week days was to be implemented in the (approx.) 10 roads who had requested it.

It was confirmed that the results of a traffic survey looking at the issues at the roundabout between Joel Street and Pinner Road would be discussed between the Councillors and Traffic Officers very shortly.

The mopeds driving across the green spaces are very difficult for the Police to deal with, particularly when they are youngsters without helmets and any chase could endanger life.

CCTV from the shops in Joel St can be helpful in deterring drug dealing. The Council is currently reviewing and upgrading its CCTV across the Borough.

The Emergency services were thanked for all they do for residents.

The President thanked people for attending.


Volunteers Needed @ CMSS



Statement on Same-Sex marriage

The members of The United Reformed Church (URC) of Eastcote and Northwood Hills, Joel Street, Northwood Hills overwhelmingly voted at a Church Meeting on 28th July 2019 to register our church building as a venue offering full marriage services to same-sex couples.

This decision speaks eloquently of an affirming and inclusive community that embraces and welcomes difference. I am delighted that we have been given the opportunity by our national church, to offer to our local community, a public symbol of the grace of God.

This vote was made possible after the United Reformed Church General Assembly (the denomination's highest policy-making body) agreed in July 2016 that decisions about whether to allow the marriage of same sex couples would be made by individual congregations, within the different legal systems of parts of the United Kingdom.

We are now in the process of completing the registration procedure, and when that is finalised, we will be in the position to offer a warm welcome to same sex couples who want to marry in our church. Details will appear on our website www.urceastcote-nwhills.org.uk

Councillors' Column

It has been another active six months for the three Northwood Hills councillors.

John Morgan finished his Mayoral year in May having raised £48,000, match-funded to £96,000.

We have had the introduction of new parking restrictions on several roads in Northwood Hills close to the station to deter commuter parking. The roads where restrictions have been introduced are where residents requested changes in two separate rounds of consultation. We will monitor the impact that these restrictions have in the coming months.

We have been working with the local Police addressing anti-social behaviour on Joel Street, supporting an increased Police presence, the granting of dispersal orders and installation of a new CCTV camera. We hope that this action will serve as a strong signal that anti-social behaviour will never be tolerated in Northwood Hills. The Council's strong commitment to preserving law and order was recently demonstrated by the swift removal of a traveller incursion on Northwood Recreation Ground. Removing travellers in a matter of hours is only possible as a result of Hillingdon Council passing appropriate measures to deal with such incursions.

Planning remains a major issue and we were recently pleased to hear that the William Jolle site is going to be brought back into use and look forward to part of the site reopening as a pub. We are also keeping a close eye on the sale of Joel Street Farm. Residents should be assured that the retention of the Green Belt remains a key priority for the Conservative administration on Hillingdon Council.

The Council's road and pavement resurfacing program continues with Tolcarne Drive being resurfaced. While we conduct an annual review of the ward's pavements and road surfaces, if there are any which need resurfacing, please let us know.

In the past few months we continue to make grants from our Ward Budget, with Haydon School and 1st Northwood Scouts as recent beneficiaries. Talking of which, it was most enjoyable to recently join the team at 1st Northwood in the opening of their fantastic new Scouting Centre.

Finally, we would like to express our congratulations to the Residents' Association on the awarding of the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service. This is an outstanding accolade for the NHRA and is testament to the extraordinary hard work of Andrew Riley and his Committee over many years.







The History of Joel Street Farm

Before the coming of the Metropolitan Line, Joel Street Farm was part of rural Eastcote. The area of land known as Joel Street Allotments was Eastcote's Poors Field. From there the farm stretched down Joel Street to Southill Farm.

The land has its own water course, now known as Joel Street Ditch, this rises at Pinner Road, flowing underground behind Hazelwood Drive and Tolcarne Drive coming above ground near the allotments and flows through the meadows joining the River Pinn at Haydon Hall.

The farm house and out buildings date back to the mid 18th century. The farm house consisted of two parlours, kitchen, dairy pantry, with 5 bedrooms above. In1860 the farm house, cottages, out buildings and farm land, consisting of 119 acres of arable, meadow and pasture was sold by Decree of the High Court of Chancery.

By 1981 the amount of land was reduced to 30 acres of first class grazing land. The out buildings increased in number and now included a bull pen, calf shed and a milk dispatch store. The owners of the farm decided to retire from farming in 1998. The land is now used for grazing horses. The out buildings are used for a Veterinary Clinic, a cattery and various small businesses. Recently the rear barn has been extended to house a children's nursery.

2005 saw an application to build a Jewish cemetery, this was contested by the residents and refused. April 2019 saw the land advertised for sale as suitable for development.

However, this land holds Green Belt status; sections of the land are designated Nature Conservation Sites of Grade 1 Importance. The land either side of Joel Street Ditch would also be classed as flood plain. The Farm House and the out buildings are Locally Listed.

LASTING POWER OF ATTORNEY

I began writing wills in 2007 and have found most responsible people usually make a will but

appointing an attorney via a lasting power of attorney to make decisions for you should you become mentally or physically incapable is an often overlooked precaution that many people do not consider.

Most people realize they are not immortal so one day they will definitely need a will but not everyone considers how their affairs will be run if they become incapable of doing it themselves, through either mental or physical incapacity.

The usual presumption is I will sort it out when the time comes, but often the time comes when it is too late, a sudden stroke or the beginnings of dementia can come along quicker than you realize and once mental incapacity arrives you cannot authorize a lasting power of attorney.

The option then is for someone to apply to the Court of Protection to volunteer to be your deputy, an expensive time consuming procedure with no guarantee they will be accepted by the court.

The government actively encourage everyone to appoint an attorney of their choosing sooner rather than too late as then the attorney/attorneys will be people you trust and more importantly who know what your wishes are regarding your property, finances and personal welfare issues.

Once you have chosen your attorney/attorneys the relevant forms can be compiled and registered with the office of the public guardian so should you ever need any help in the future you already have in place the person/people you want with the authority to make decisions on your behalf for your benefit.

Most companies/solicitors charge very substantial fees to help with the compilation and registration of a lasting power of attorney, often costing up to £400, because I have come across far too many people who have left it too late to do an LPA I like to encourage everyone to put an LPA in place so only charge £60, this includes visiting the person who wants to give the LPA to explain how it works, contacting the attorney/attorneys to ensure they sign their relevant pages and registering the document with the Office of the Public Quardian.

There is a registration fee based on annual income; If annual income is over £12,000.00 the fee is £82.00. If under £12,000.00 the fee is £41. You can also get exemption from paying the fee if you are on certain benefits.




